ROSALYN L. BANDMAN SCHOLARSHIP

The Rosalyn L. Bandman scholarship provides recognition and financial support to an outstanding graduate student in the field of social work who is interested in pursuing a career in medical social work. The recipient will be awarded a \$1,500.00 scholarship and have an opportunity to complete their MSW II graduate internship at Children's Hospital, if desired.

Qualified applicants for this scholarship must be:

- Graduate students in a school of social work accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE)
- Pursuing a career in clinical social work
- In good academic standing at the college or university

Applications should include:

- A one page cover letter to the evaluation committee with a name, address, and phone number of the applicant and the applicant's school of social work.
- A typed, double-spaced statement (no more than four pages) which demonstrates the candidate's commitment to pediatric health care and to the improvement of the psychosocial well-being of children through a description of:
 1. Relevant work/ volunteer experience
 2. Focus of academic studies
 3. Short and long-term career objectives
- One letter of reference from each of the following:
 1. A professor or academic advisor
 2. An individual knowledgeable about your professional interests and abilities
 3. Current field instructor
